January 5, 2026
Minutes

A business meeting of the Center Township Board of Supervisors was held on Monday, January 5, 2026 at 5:15 p.m. at the Township Office in Rogersville. Present were Paul Cook, Chairman, Daniel R. Stoneking, Vice Chairman, Harry D. Gillispie, Supervisor and N. Dawn Horr, Secretary. No visitors were present.

Harry made a motion to approve the minutes of the December business and budget adoption meetings. Dan seconded and the motion was carried unanimously.

Dan made a motion to approve the bills as presented with the exception of the check payable to Fox Ford in the amount of \$141.87 as the service should have been under warranty. Harry seconded and the motion was carried unanimously.

Dan made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 1-2026 adopting the county's 2025 Hazard Mitigation Plan. Harry seconded and all approved.

Dan made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2-2026 setting the Sewage Enforcement Officer's fee schedule. Harry seconded and the motion was carried.

Harry made a motion to table advertising for bids for stone until the February meeting. It will not be necessary to request bids for the diesel fuel as we are under the bidding threshold. Dan seconded and the motion was carried unanimously.

Paul made a motion to purchase a 2026 Ford F-450 flatbed truck with a 9.5' Western steel V-plow package and a stainless hydraulic hopper spreader package. The truck will be purchased through the Costars program with Fox Ford for a total cost of \$111,371.50. Dan seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Paul made a motion to sell the 2018 Ford F-250 with the plow and spreader on Municibid once the new truck has been delivered. Dan seconded and the motion was carried unanimously.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Paul. Dan seconded and the meeting was adjourned at 5:24 p.m.

**Greene County 2025 Hazard Mitigation Plan
Municipal Adoption Resolution**

Resolution No. 1-2026

Center Township, Greene County, Pennsylvania

WHEREAS, Center Township, Greene County, Pennsylvania is most vulnerable to natural and human-made hazards which may result in loss of life and property, economic hardship, and threats to public health and safety, and

WHEREAS, Section 322 of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA 2000) requires state and local governments to develop and submit for approval to the President a mitigation plan that outlines processes for identifying their respective natural hazards, risks, and vulnerabilities, and

WHEREAS, Center Township acknowledges the requirements of Section 322 of DMA 2000 to have an approved Hazard Mitigation Plan as a prerequisite to receiving post-disaster Hazard Mitigation Grant Program funds, and

WHEREAS, the Greene County 2025 Hazard Mitigation Plan has been developed by the Greene County Commissioners and the Greene County Emergency Management Agency in cooperation with other county departments, and officials and citizens of Center Township and

WHEREAS, a public involvement process consistent with the requirements of DMA 2000 was conducted to develop the Greene County 2025 Hazard Mitigation Plan, and

WHEREAS, the Greene County 2025 Hazard Mitigation Plan recommends mitigation activities that will reduce losses to life and property affected by both natural and human-made hazards that face the County and its municipal governments,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body for Center Township:


- The Greene County 2025 Hazard Mitigation Plan is hereby adopted as the official Hazard Mitigation Plan of the Township of Center and
- The respective officials and agencies identified in the implementation strategy of the Greene County 2025 Hazard Mitigation Plan are hereby directed to implement the recommended activities assigned to them.



(Includes up to 4 soils test pits, 1 percolation test, 1 design review, 1 contractor consultation, 1 interim site visit and 1 final inspection)

New Construction (single lot)	\$800.00
Repair (existing system without soils testing)	\$500.00
Repair (existing system with soils testing)	\$800.00
(additional testing to be billed at \$200.00 per test pit location)	
Second percolation test at time of original percolation test	\$300.00
Second percolation test at a later date	\$400.00

NOTE: Fee for new construction does not include Component 1 Planning Module completion if site is part of a lot split or subdivision. PNDI search is also not included. Applicant is responsible for planning module. Guidance is given.

(Includes up to 8 soils test pits, 2 percolation tests, 2 design reviews, 1 contractor consultation, 1 interim site visit and 1 final inspection)


